

## We live in interesting times

These disruptions result largely from:

- Increasing gyrations in climate and weather.
- Worsening inequalities of wealth, income, and political influence.

So now we have a competition over what new system will replace the old one. The oligarchs actively organize and agitate for their preferences. We must out-organize them for the new system we need.



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
